City of Preston Regular City Council Meeting January 13, 2020

Mayor Richard Betts called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: A motion was made to approve the agenda as presented. Motion made by P. Hoffman, seconded by M. Petersen. Ayes 4, Nays 0. Motion carried.

## CITIZEN / PUBLIC COMMENTS: None

MARC RUDEN, IIW: Ruden explained to Council that the Sponsored Project Application is due March 2<sup>nd</sup> and that IIW would like to get working on it. IIW's fees for services would be \$11,600 for writing the grant application. The Sponsored Project Grant is for \$100,000. Ruden went on to explain that the City would know in June if the City is awarded the grant. After that there are two other grants the City can apply for; the Water Quality Initiative Grant through IDALS (IA Dept. of Agriculture) and a CDBG Grant. Total grant money possible is approximately \$700,000. A motion was made by P. Hoffman to accept the agreement as written. Seconded by M. Petersen. Ayes 4, Nays 0. Motion carried.

DAVE HEIAR: Heiar reviewed with Mayor and Council their roles and responsibilities along with the City Administrator and staff. Heiar also discussed being a team and how important communication is within elected officials and administration. Heiar recommended that Council review the Council Manuel that was in their packet and suggested that they adopt the manual. Heiar discussed committees and what is their value. Members of Council felt that committees have assisted with alleviating some of the workload of the Clerk's office. Heiar suggested reviewing the committees and possibly eliminating some of them. Heiar stated that each time there is a committee meeting an agenda needs to be posted and minutes taken. Discussion between Heiar and Council.

CONSENT AGENDA: R. Petersen had a question in regards to the Lynch Dallas expenditure, it was stated that it is correct. P. Hoffman made a motion to approve the consent agenda as presented, seconded by A. Sullivan. Ayes 4, Nays 0. Passed.

28E AGREEMENTS: The Mayor informed Council that there is a handout provided by Alex Lieu to summarize the conversation he had with Mayor and Council via telephone at a previous council meeting. Discussion regarding the cost for service and what is included in the cost. The total cost for an officer for Preston is \$48.26 per hour. P. Hoffman stated that she feels that the dollar amount is accurate. A. Sullivan mentioned that Lieu noted that the Iowa State Patrol charges \$36 per hour. M. Petersen thinks we need to charge \$48 per hour. P. Hoffman stated we need to cover our costs. A. Sullivan stated that we shouldn't include the cars in the cost. M. Petersen stated that the cars are part of the costs. A. Sullivan likes the recommendation of \$38 per hour. After much more discussion it was decided to table the item until more detailed salary information is provided. (M. Petersen left the meeting at 7:25 pm).

LIBRARY: The Friends of the Library purchased a large projection screen for events such as the "Sons & Daughters of Thunder" that will be presented at the Preston Town Hall. One of the note comments

made by the delegation upon not receiving an Iowa Great Places designation was that Preston needed more artistic events. Sound equipment is needed to show movies and use at different indoor as well as outdoor events. It was requested that the council approval going forward with writing grants and raising funds for the sound equipment. A. Sullivan questioned why the Library would need the Council's approval. The Mayor stated that in the past grants were written without prior knowledge of all council members and it caused a problem. Some grants require submission happen through the city. It is important to create events through various partnerships to have a positive outcome when working toward an Iowa Great Places designation. A. Sullivan made a motion to allow grants for a sound system to be written. P. Hoffman seconded. 3 Ayes, Nays O. Passed.

UPDATE ON RECYCLING IN JACKSON COUNTY: The Mayor attended a Mayor's meeting in St. Donatus and the mayor's questioned what will happen with the recycling in Jackson County beyond June 20<sup>th</sup> when DAC will no longer receive recycling? The county doesn't know what they are going to do as of yet. Richard Rossman attended the Waste Management Authority Meeting today, January 13<sup>th</sup>. Rossman told the Clerk's Office that the Authority is still investigating options and he will keep us updated.

UPDATE ON ELECTRIC PLANT: Carl Tawny provided an update to T. Weinschenk. Weinschenk addressed Council explaining that a couple of issues have been identified and Carl already has the solutions. He also explained the results of Saturday's mother nature test run. We had scheduled a black start test for Saturday the 11th. Due to weather we postponed it until Saturday the 18th. As luck would have it, mother nature decided to test it for us and the settings in the protective relay are set to tight to accommodate the imbalance of the load when isolated from the utility. We will be addressing this tomorrow (Tuesday) during our testing with an all-out effort to be prepared for the Saturday 18th black start test.

- -Schedule, as it is now the plan is to install the catalyst on the silencer on Friday the 17th.
- -The emissions and urge test are scheduled on Jan 28th.

UPDATE ON CATALYST GRANT: Nic Hockenberry (JCEA) and P. Hoffman met with Don at the Preston Times regarding the Catalyst Grant. Don had a couple of questions which Hockenberry is checking into and will get answers back to Don. P. Hoffman is moving forward with the pre-application. Weinschenk reached out to Marla (ECIA) to get a quote for writing the full application once the pre-application has been approved. Hockenberry is confident that council person, P. Hoffman, can write the pre-application. P. Hoffman has done this before for the Hometown Café and it was accepted. P. Hoffman is going to continue completing the pre-application and get it to Hockenberry for his review this week so he can proof and tweak if necessary. P. Hoffman feels we are in a good spot.

MLA PART 2: Weinschenk emailed a link to the videos for Council to view. The presenter's this year are very good. The Mayor impressed upon the Council how important it is to review these videos since we will be working on budget here shortly. Mayor Betts wrapped this discussion with, "Please view the videos in the next two weeks."

Mayor Betts requested a motion to adjourn. Motion made by P. Hoffman, seconded by A. Sullivan. Ayes 3, Nays 0. Meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
